

How does **RN Delegation** work?



Door to Door

M - F | 8am - 5pm | \$145 an hour
M - F | 5pm - 8am | \$195 an hour
Sat and Sun | \$195 an hour



According to WA state law, a nurse must delegate caregivers **every 90 days**.

STEP 1

Nurse obtains written permission from the client's doctor in order to delegate.



STEP 2

Nurse verifies the caregiver's credentials and observes them performing the task.



STEP 3

Nurse completes delegation paperwork, allowing the caregiver to legally do the tasks.

What **can** and **must** be delegated?

- Medication Administration
- In & Out Catheters
- Tube Feedings
- Colostomy Care
- Blood Glucose Monitoring
- Insulin Pen Injections
- Non-sterile Dressing Changes



Delegation MATTERS.

Delegation Check-Ins can be done over the phone after an in-person delegation has been conducted and the nurse feels confident in the skills of the caregiver.
